

Garbage Disposal Rules

(1) Please separate garbage properly and put it I in designated bags.


Garbage that is not in Kariya-city designated garbage bags or designated garbage collection bags will not be collected. (Do not use plastic bags)



Collection begins at 8 am. Collection times may vary depending on road conditions and the amount of garbage put out.

(3) Please put your garbage out in the designated locations.

If your local district or management company has its own rules, please follow those rules.



Please take the designated collection bags home within the day and use them repeatedly

What to Put Out at Garbage Stations



Recyclable Paper

The three types that will be collected are newspaper, magazines, and cardboard.

Newspaper (including advertisements)

Books, notebooks, pamphlets, catalogs, copy paper, calendars (remove any metal bits), envelopes, postcards, notepad paper, cardstock, drawing paper, penmanship paper, posters, paper file folders, etc

- Separate by type and tie in a tight package knot (plus-shaped knot).
- Separate by type at the garbage station.

- Please exclude non-paper materials, including the clear plastic on envelopes with windows and metal bits on paper file folders.
- ●Make sure that small pieces of paper are put out so they don't make a mess by putting them into envelopes, inserting them inside magazines, etc.
- The following items should be disposed of as burnable garbage: Waterproof paper, paper cups, paper plates, carbon paper (e.g. for copying documents), thermal paper, photographs, shredded paper, stickers, photo albums, dirty paper.

Oversized Garbage

"Oversized Garbage" refers to everyday living items which do not fit in the designated garbage collection bags.

When applying for door to door collection of oversized garbage (800 yen per piece)

Please call the information desk on \$\frac{75}{62}\$-2000 Collected every Wednesday. The number of acceptances is limited, so please register well in advance. Office hours art from 8:30 to 5:00 every day. The office is not open over the Ner Year Holiday period.

Recyclable Home Appliances

(televisions, refrigerators/freezers, washing machines, clothes drying machines and air conditioners) As of March 1, 2025

The home appliances that are currently classed as recyclable are televisions, air conditioners, refrigerators/freezers, washing machines and clothes drying machines. *First, ask the dealer from whom you purchased the product, or the dealer from whom you will purchase the new product.

The recycling fee may differ depending on the manufacturer. Be sure to check the manufacturer. In addition, you must pay a recycling fee and a collection and transportation fee (2,000 yen for ① below, and 1,200 yen for ② below) at a post office in Kariya City (including postal agencies).

 When applying for door to door collection of recycled home appliances. (recycling fee plus 2,000 yen)

3 When taking items to the designated collection location (recycling fee only)


